**Even though** I bought a bottle of wine I didn't drink it.

3) Did Milly go out last night **or** did she stay at home?

4) I must shut a window **because** it is so windy.

**As / Since** it is so windy, I must shut a window.

5) It was cold **so** we didn't go swimming.

It was cold **that's why** we didn't go swimming. It was cold **therefore** we didn't go swimming.

6) **Before** you answer the question think carefully.

7) **When** Mrs Miller came in she was pale in the face.

8) Liz wants to have **both** new trousers **and** a new pullover.

9) **Neither** Tom **nor** Nick like popcorn.

10) You can have a sandwich **or** you can have a toast.

You can have **either** a sandwich **or** a toast.

You can have **both** a sandwich **and** a toast.

11) Stella was tired **that's why / so** she went to bed.

12) Eve studied a lot **in order to** get a good report.

Eve studied a lot **to** get a good report.

Eve wanted to get a good report **that's why** she studied a lot.

13) It was rainy and stormy **nevertheless** they went for a walk.

**Although / Though / Even though** it was rainy and stormy, they went for a walk.

14) We can go **either** to the Greek restaurant **or** to the Italian restaurant.

We can go **both** to the Greek restaurant **and** to the Italian restaurant.

15) Her new friend is **not only** very charming **but** nice and polite **as well**.

Her new friend is **not only** very charming **but also** nice and polite.

16) They bought the new car. They drove to Paris.

**As soon as** they bought the new car, they drove to Paris.
